COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM

The Outreach Program is a way to get involved with community service! Just sign up, show up, and you'll be on your way to a meaningful service experience! Projects are offered at a variety of nonprofit agencies and there are projects to choose from almost every day of the week. To get involved: **Step 1**: Check out the schedule <u>here</u>; **Step 2**: Choose a project that matches your interests/availability, and sign up in the project binders in the lobby at the Center for Leadership & Social Change; **Step 3**: Show up at the Center at the designated project arrival time. You'll meet your Project Facilitators and get checked in; **Step 4**: Enjoy the Outreach project experience, which includes introductions, a pre-service explanation, hands-on service off campus, and a facilitated reflection discussion afterward; **Step 5**: Record your service using the ServScript Program by the deadline (August 7th for the summer term); Step 6: REPEAT steps 2 through 5 all semester long! FEDERAL WORK STUDY POSITION: CENTER OPERATIONS STUDENT ASSISTANT

This position is funded by the Federal Work-Study Program. Please make sure you have been received the Federal Work-Study Award prior to applying. There are multiple specialized positions available - receptionist, fleet management assistant, evening staff, and programmatic support staff. Student Assistants are responsible for performing a wide variety of important tasks such as assisting with daily operations, upkeep of the Center, and/or assisting with cluster programs. Student Assistants will have the opportunity to cover the front desk as needed (answering phones and assisting visitors who come in seeking information or services). Students should be able to work 8 to 10 hours per week, Monday through Friday with the willingness to perform a shift during evening hours. Duties include: maintaining the department's fleet of vans (filling up with gas, replenishing forms, data entry of mileage logs, transporting to/from repair shop, etc.); organizing/cleaning spaces in the building (storage closets, work rooms, etc.); research and training related to multiculturalism, identity and diversity awareness; and helping with other special projects.
